Elimination of Single-Use Items

1. Eliminate Single-Use Water Bottles and Provide Water Refill Stations

- The event was a "No Single Use Plastic" event. Participants, volunteers and employees all used reusable bottles and the club hydration stations.
- Reusable bottles were given to participants



2. Eliminate Plastic Straws

 Ballyholme Yacht Club does not make straws generally available, though does have biodegradable straws available should a client require one due to disability requirements.

3. Serve Food with Plastic-Free Dinnerware

All meals were served in reusable crockery.

4. Use or Provide Reusable Bags

- Cloth bags provided for every participant, volunteer and employee.
- Volunteer encouraged to bring their own bags too.
- Paper wrapped sandwiches



7. Involve Local Organisations

- Supplies sources locally for catering, boat repair, management.
- Volunteers from local community.
- Link with the RYA NI Green Blue programme https://thegreenblue.org.uk/ an environment programme with the Royal Yachting Association and British Marine. They advise clubs, sailors and event organisers on how to reduce their environmental impact.
- Signed up to THE Final Straw Foundation https://finalstrawfoundation.org/ a registered charity set up to work with local communities and business to highlight the impact of plastic pollution and try to minimize the amount of plastic entering our local seas and oceans. They collaborate with other organisations.
- Sourced funding for commercially labled recycling bins from local council.
- A campaign with The Woodland Trust to plant 700 saplings was an overwhelming success.












8. Post Educational and Reusable Signage

Bird Watch Ireland and Irish Whale and Dolphin Group Posters



10. Organize a Green Team

- Charlie Winton of Ballyholme Yacht Club was the Green Team lead with Gail MacAllister of Irish Sailing support and a large team of volunteers at the club ...
 - o Ellie Mackey set up bin signs
 - gave a talk to the bar staff on how to use the bins correctly and introduced them to the 'bin-ovation' app.
 - helped collect the rubbish from rescues crews and put in to correct bins
 - o oversaw the beach clean competition
 - Michelle Farmer is studying sustainability at university and gave us lots of advice and helped on one of the event days
 - Louise Hubbard gave a lot of advice on the wider issue of sustainability and via her work with Business in the community NI has put me in touch with other organisations for help and funding (ongoing)
 - Kaitlyn helped with collecting rubbish from rescue crews and with the beach clean and general rubbish collecting.



Kaitlyn (from the Green Team) collected the lunch and sorted it as the Race Officials came off the water.

 A wide variety of waste disposal options and locations are made available for participants.




12. Divert Food Waste from the Landfill

14. Host a Beach or Marina Cleanup

18. Use Eco-Smart Race Management Techniques

- What's App groups created to provide consistent communication of results, etc. to participants
- No paper Sailing Instructions
- What's App for all comms
- No sponsor bow stickers
- Viewing platform awareness
- Media boat active on the water time kept to minimum required
- Committee boat anchored, engine off, use of holding tank
- Using racingrulesofsailing.org for all protest hearing information, submissions, and reports
- Facilitate a lunch rib, reduces waste on the water
- Retirees sent to mothership and brought in groups rather than individually
- Online briefings to reduce sound pollution with speaker systems

19. Prevent Toxins from Entering the Water

• Bad bio socs available and spill kits at refuelling station and an emergency action plan.



20. Encourage Green Boating Practices

- All participants were reminded of the Environmental standards of the event and Rule 47 active
- Power off when at anchor or on mooring, control of number of support boats, awareness of unnecessary speed.

PLUS

- New bean to cup coffee machine introduced to eliminate pods
- Crisp packet collection
- Created a Sustainability Club Whatsapp for future collaboration.
- Bike racks fitted for the event

LEGACY

- More members now cycle to the club
- Additional recycle bins added since to ensure easy recycling and sorting of waste.
- Reusable outdoor glasses were purchased with the Ards and North Down Council Tourism Grant.
- Currently processing an application to join a local sustainability Tourism Network Group "AND Sustainable Giants".
- The local beach clean is now to become a regular club activity.
- Club now has a policy of sustainable prizes e.g. a local potter for a youth event.
